

Youth Programs: JROTC / Eagle / Essay

Your Hawaii SAR dues provide support to three youth projects: JROTC/ROTC/Sea Cadets, Eagle Scout recognitions, and the Knight Essay Contest.

JROTC/ROTC/Sea Cadets: HISSAR awards are given to an outstanding cadet from each University of Hawaii Manoa Army and Air Force units, as well as to Hawaii high school units (Junior ROTC) – a total of 27 awards, and available to Sea Cadets Pacific-wide. ROTC/JROTC medal presentations are made at the end of April and the first week in May, with volunteer assistance needed for each of the high school unit's recognition events. The events are all the way from the Big Island to Kauai – and even possible events in Guam and Saipan, with the dates of the presentations usually received at the end of March. Several events are relatively short and immediately after school while some are along the lines of a formal dinner – a “dinning-in” mess.

Hawaii Eagle Scout Scholarship Program: The Hawaii SAR Eagle Scout Scholarship program which has an award based on an application with an essay, with additional recognitions available for Eagle Scouts at the local Courts of Honor.

Essay: The Knight Essay Contest is being re-activated on the state level, which will have an award for a submitted essay, as well as making the applicant eligible for national SAR participation.... *Additional member participation is welcome, in judging and in award presentation.*

National Library Move (Center for Advancing America's Heritage CAAH)

The National SAR Library is building out the interior of our newly purchased historic downtown Louisville building for a move of our library records in Fall of next year. Our books, genealogical records and headquarters operation are currently squeezed into a building near downtown. The new building is immediately across from the Louisville Slugger Museum, a site that will give us much expanded visibility, in addition to providing the needed space and allowing us to develop lesson plans and resources for our educational component. The Library contract has been started, with the second component of the project, the headquarters contract, waiting funding.


With Washington All The Way! **2010 Memorial Service to Honor Hawaii Compatriot's Ancestor John Shepherd**

John Shepherd served in two wars with George Washington, being at "Braddock's defeat" when the British commanding general was killed and Lt. Col. Washington (one of Braddock's aide-de-camps) assumed active direction of the British and colonial remnants in the withdrawal from Pennsylvania (in the French and Indian War), as well as with Washington throughout the Revolutionary War. Private Shepherd the last survivor of Braddock's ill-fated expedition and the longest lived soldier of the American Revolution – having fought at Brandywine, Germantown and White Marsh, as well as wintering at Valley Forge – when he died in Ohio in 1847 at the age of 117 years and nine months. He is the 4th great grandfather of Hawaii Compatriot Charles Phebus.

A grave marking ceremony to commemorate the life and military service of John Shepherd is scheduled for next summer in North Royalton, Ohio (near Cleveland). The ceremony has been endorsed by many groups as an opportunity to provide long-overdue recognition of Shepherd's civic service, with a major two-day event, including city plans for a parade, re-enacter groups (French and Indian and American Revolution), bag pipers, fifes and drums, an ox roast, and a visit by a traveling full-sized Liberty Bell. The event will be June 26 and 27, 2010.

Major General Edward Braddock was the Commander-in-Chief of all the British forces on the Continent during the French and Indian War, losing his life near what is now Pittsburgh when Indian-style attacks defeated the British Regulars and Virginia militia. The loss was considered an important lesson to many colonial militiamen, including the Virginia leader Washington. North Carolina and Maryland regiments were part of the Pennsylvania expedition.
