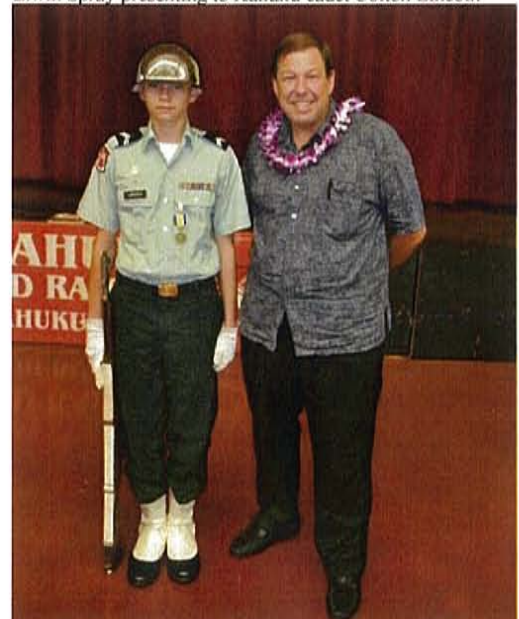

Dedication of New National SAR Library

– September 25, 2010

The new library is a reality. And with it the first component of the CAAH – the Center for the Advancement of America’s Heritage. The SAR as an organization made the commitment about ten years ago that to be merely the custodian of genealogical records was not enough; that we needed to

dedicate ourselves to using our resources to educate America’s youth. Although this had been part of our charter from the beginning, we felt that if we did not pursue education aggressively, our history was in danger of being forgotten. Thus the start to move us into the mainstream of education rather than just a repository: a large/ enough space to try programs, space for media production and for visitors, increased visibility (across for the popular Louisville Slugger Baseball Museum) and commitment to new programs like the West Point history
